Each month we will by highlighting one way.

Yard Maintenance

Are you one of those people that finds cutting the grass, weeding the garden, or planting flowers relaxing? If your answer is YES! This may be the perfect way to spread love and help to a host family. Don't forget to plan logistics & check weather before you offer. Do they have a lawn mower/weed whacker you can borrow? Do they have enough gas? Do they need help spreading mulch, weeding, planting, etc? This is something that could be done even if the family isn't home. What a wonderful surprise to come home to!

Don't have time to offer to do the deed yourself? Why not hire a company to come out once or twice a month to cut the grass. You could be helping a small business and host family at the same time.
